

Presidents Message

Dear friends & fellow members,

Wonder Women is a diverse female-led conference. This event brings together bold and ambitious women to connect, educate, inspire and empower one another to take on new and expanded roles in work, community and life. It encourages all women to own their ambition, break down barriers, and unleash their superpowers.

Women's empowerment is promoting women's sense of self-worth, their ability to determine their own choices,

THE HONOURABLEJODY WILSON-RAYBOULD

The Honourable Jody Wilson-Raybould, P.C., Q.C., served as the Independent Member of Parliament for Vancouver Granville, Minister of Justice and Attorney General of Canada, the Minister of Veterans Affairs, and the Associate Minister of National Defence until her resignation in 2019. That same year, she ran as an Independent candidate for Vancouver Granville and, upon winning the election, became the first woman to be elected as an Independent Member of Parliament.

Wilson-Raybould is a lawyer, an advocate, an author, and a leader among Canada's First Nations. She has been a provincial crown prosecutor, a councillor for the We Wai Kai Nation, a chair of the First Nations Finance Authority and has served as BC regional chief of the Assembly of First Nations.

Wilson-Raybould is a descendant of the Musgamagw Tsawataineuk and Laich-Kwil-Tach peoples, which are part of the Kwakwaka'wakw and also known as the Kwak'wala-speaking peoples. She is a member of the We Wai Kai Nation. Her traditional name. Puglaas, means "woman born to noble people."

As an author, in 2021, Wilson-Raybould released her political memoir "Indian" in the Cabinet, which became a #1 national bestseller and was a finalist for The Writers' Trust Balsillie Prize for Public Policy and in 2019, she released From Where I Stand: Rebuilding Indigenous Nations for a Stronger Canada.

Harriette Schumacher is a Certified Executive Coach and Women's Leadership Development Expert. Harriette has been studying leadership for the past two decades and has been studying female leaders her whole life. Harriette is on a mission to help women ascend into positions of power and keep them there. In 2020, Harriette launched LeadHERship, a global leadership development program for women who want to get seen, heard, recognized and promoted.

She has been named one of Yahoo Finances Top Coaches to Watch, an RBC Women of Influence Nominee, a WXN Canada's Most Powerful Women, and was recently featured on Global News talking about the impact of Covid-19 on working women. CIBC Square Building Tour

On August 31, Real Estate Institute of Canada, Toronto Chapter, organized a building tour of CIBC Square located at 81 & 141 Bay Street. The completion of the first tower, located just south of Union Station, has set a new standard of interconnectivity and integration of city transit and pedestrian traffic. It has created a variety of space for the public and surrounding neighborhoods.

Through a partnership between Ivanhoe Cambridge and Hines, architects WilkinsonEyre and Adamson Associates designed the two towers that will total 3 million square feet. It's forward thinking features and amenities include a specialty restaurant and food hall, direct links to all Toronto transit channels, conference centre, first-class fitness facility, bicycle storage, delivery shuttle, one-acre elevated park above the rail corridor, and more.









We enjoyed a behinds the scenes look of a rare full floor mechanical room and subtle intricacies of public traffic flow, as well as the exclusive tenant areas to enjoy away from the office. When we look north beyond the tracks, 141 Bay St tower is well under way to be completed.


